# FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS (C)

**TODAY'S MASS READING**: Parish Mass Book, from page 192. **1st Reading** (Num.21:4b-9 ).**2nd Reading** (Phil.2:6-11). **Gospel** (Jn.3:13-17)

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, a feast that may sound strange at first. After all, why exalt an instrument of torture and death? But that's exactly what we do today: we lift high the Cross because for us, it is no longer a symbol of defeat, but of victory; no longer a sign of shame, but of glory. In the time of Jesus, the cross was a tool of humiliation and execution. Crucifixion was the most painful and degrading death reserved for criminals and slaves. And yet, Jesus took that very symbol of horror and transformed it into the greatest sign of God's love. As St. Paul writes in the letter to the Philippians (today's second reading), "He humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him." So, the Cross becomes the paradox at the heart of our faith: Through death comes life. Through humiliation comes exaltation. Through weakness comes power. It's easy to admire the Cross in a beautiful church or wear it around our necks. But Christ calls us to something deeper: "If anyone would come after me,

let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." This means the Cross is not just something Jesus carried, it's something we carry too. The crosses in our lives, our sufferings, burdens, sacrifices aren't meaningless. When united to Christ, they become redemptive. They can even become the path through which God saves us and others. Do you have a cross today? A physical illness, a wounded relationship, a silent suffering? Don't run from it. Don't waste it. Unite it to Jesus. Let it be transformed. We live in a world that fears suffering and runs from sacrifice. But as Christians, we know that love always involves the cross. Every act of real love, whether it's parenting, forgiving, caring for the sick, standing up for truth comes with a cost. But the Cross teaches us that that cost is worth it. Because Good Friday was not the end. Easter Sunday came. In the same way, our own crosses will not be the end. If we carry them with Christ, we too will rise with Him. So today, we don't glorify suffering we glorify love that suffers willingly for the sake of others. We don't exalt pain, we exalt the One who bore our pain to give us eternal life. Let us look to the Cross not as a defeat, but as a daily invitation to love more deeply, to suffer more generously, and to trust more fully in the God who can bring resurrection out of anything. We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You, because by Your Holy Cross, You have redeemed the world. Amen.
