TODAY'S MASS READING: Parish Mass Book, from page 133. **1st Reading** (Wis. 9:13-18). **2nd Reading** (Philemon 9b-10,12-17). **Gospel** (Lk.14: 25-33)

Readings Next Sunday: 1st Reading (Num.21: 4b-9). 2nd Reading (Phil. 2:6-11). Gospel (Jn. 3:13-17)

Today's Gospel presents us with one of the most challenging teachings of Jesus. As crowds follow Him, excited by His miracles and teachings,

Jesus turns to them not to entertain or impress, but to tell the hard truth: "Whoever does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters... even his own life, cannot be my disciple." At first glance, this sounds harsh. How can Jesus, who commands us to love, tell us to "hate" our families? But Jesus is using strong language to make a powerful point: Nothing, not even our closest relationships should come before Him. This is not about being against family or life. It's about putting God first, above all else. It's about being ready to carry our cross to accept sacrifices, to make hard choices, to follow Christ even when it's uncomfortable or unpopular. Jesus compares discipleship to building a tower or going into battle. He says: Count the cost. Don't start unless you're willing to finish. He's telling us: Being a Christian is not just about feelings or good intentions it requires commitment and sacrifice. So, what does this mean for us today? We live in a world that promotes comfort, convenience, and compromise. But Jesus calls us to be different. He calls us to: Put faith over fear. Choose truth over popularity. Live with eternity in mind, not just the here and now. For some, carrying the cross might mean standing up for their faith in a secular workplace. For others, it might mean forgiving someone who has deeply hurt them. For many, it simply means remaining faithful in the daily struggles, caring for a sick relative, resisting temptation, or praying when you don't feel like it. All of us are called to follow Jesus with our whole heart not half, not sometimes, but fully. That is the cost of discipleship. But here's the good news: while discipleship costs us something, it gives us so much more, peace, purpose, joy, and eternal life. Jesus never said the road would be easy, but He promised to walk with us every step of the way. So today, let's ask ourselves: What are the "crosses" I'm being asked to carry? What am I holding on to that might be holding me back from following Jesus completely? Let's pray for the grace to put Christ first and follow Him, no matter the cost. Amen


